
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Sri Lanka Demographic Survey 1994 Sectoral Distribution of the Population

Foreword

The Demographic Survey 1994 conducted by the Department gives some valuable information on demographic and socio economic characteristics of the population. The first report on the survey based on the enumerator's summaries was released in March 1995, which provide demographic information at District and Divisional Secretary Division level.

Since the survey covers only the population in households, there is an under-estimation in the urban population. As such, it is not possible to release the sectoral distribution of the survey population, unless an adjustment is made to include the urban household population which affects mainly the urban population.

The current data on urban population is in much demand and to fulfill the urgent needs of the users, an attempt has been made by Ms. S.M.Rajapakse, Statistician of the Sample Survey Division to make the necessary adjustments and provide population information by sectors.

I hope the planners, policy makers and researchers would find the information presented in this document invaluable in the absence of recent demographic data. The usefulness of this publication is enhanced as it contains population figures pertaining to districts and sectors with a breakdown of Municipal and Urban Council areas.



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Demographic Survey 1994 Sectoral distribution of the population

1 Introduction

The Census of Population and Housing of Sri Lanka scheduled for 1991 was not taken as the prevailing conditions in the Northern and Eastern Provinces are not conducive to carry out a census. As such Department of Census and Statistics conducted a large scale Demographic Survey 1994 (excluding Northern and Eastern Provinces) to meet the urgent demand from planners and other data users. The information collected in this survey is similar to those collected through a Census of Population and Housing.

This survey covered all the households in the island (excluding Northern and Eastern Provinces) irrespective of the number of boarders and lodgers residing in a housing unit. The population in institutions such as hostels, police and military barracks, camps, etc., was excluded from the survey.

Demographic Survey 1994 results reveal only the population living in households (see household definition), and this survey does not include the population living in institutions. If one wants to study the population dispersion in the country both households as well as institutional populations have to be considered. As such a problem arises as to how the Demographic Survey data can be supplemented in order to get a full picture of the country's (excluding Northern and Eastern provinces) population.

Institutions are located mainly in urban areas than in rural areas and thus this population is substantial in major cities and towns. Technological advancements, development in manufacturing, commerce and social welfare are some of the factors that caused the influx of people from rural to urban and growth of urban centers. Those who come to cities leaving families behind, for occupation, studies and in search of welfare facilities usually reside in institutions such as hostels, chummaries, barracks, elders' homes etc,. The characteristics specific to this population are not reflected in the survey population. Therefore exclusion of 'institutions' in the survey has had much effect on the coverage of urban population and thus the sectoral distribution of the population would be an under estimation.

2 Related Definitions

Household/Housing unit

- (a) Census (1981)- 'Housing unit' is a place of residence which is separate from other places of residence and has an independent access. It may be either a building or a part of a building or a group of buildings. In the case of a room or set of rooms rented out in a building, will form a separate housing unit if the above conditions fulfill. Housing units with more than 5 boarders or lodgers are considered as living quarters other than housing units.
- (b) Demographic Survey (1994) A household is a single person or a group of persons who normally live together and have common cooking arrangements. It is not necessary that they be related to each other. Domestic servants, boarders and lodgers who live and share their meals are treated as members of the household. (There is no upper limit for the number of boarders and lodgers in a household) Persons who usually live in a house but are temporarily away on holiday, out on business or receiving treatment in a hospital etc., included as members of the household. Temporary visitors are excluded.

Living quarters other than housing units

- (a) Census (1981) A building or a group of buildings where a number of persons generally not related to each other resides under the supervision of a central authority will be regarded as 'Living quarters other than housing units' such as convents, boarding schools, hospitals, prisons, police barracks and hostel etc., Boarding houses and lodging houses where more than 5 boarders or lodgers reside, rest houses and hotels which provide shelter in return for a fee are also treated as in this group.
- (b) Demographic Survey (1994) This is a building or a group of buildings where number of persons generally not related to each other resides under the supervision of a central authority. eg convents, hostels, police barracks, chummaries etc,.

Urban

- (a) Census (1981) Areas under Municipal Councils, Urban Councils and Town Councils were considered as Urban.
- (b) Demographic Survey (1994) Only areas under Municipal Councils and Urban Councils are treated as Urban.

Differences in definitions

In the Demographic Survey, 'household' definition is expected to include all the boarders and lodgers in it irrespective of the number where as in the Census 1981 housing units with more than 5 boarders and lodgers were included under 'living quarters other than housing units'.

The household population in the survey includes those who have gone abroad temporarily, inmates in hospitals and those who are in prisons. Therefore the population in the survey captured more people than the household population counted in the Census.

3 Methodology

Since the 'institutional' population has to be estimated to bridge the gap between the survey population and the total population, data source available on the institutional population in the Census of Population 1981 could be used as the benchmark data. Demographic Survey population could then be adjusted using population in 'institutions' from Census 1981. Table 2 shows the population living in housing units and living quarters (other than housing units) separately at the Census of Population 1981.

An assumption has been made that the growth rate which prevailed in each urban locality in 1981 remained constant all through the years upto 1994.

The population in 'living quarters other than housing units' in 1994 is obtained by multiplying the household population derived from the Demographic Survey-1994 by the proportion of population in living quarters to the total population in 1981. This procedure has been applied to each urban locality in the island (excluding Northern and Eastern provinces) and derived their institutional populations, Rural areas in each district was taken as one whole unit without separating to administrative units and computed the institutional population, due to data limitations. These were aggregated to derive the district total.

4 Discussion

Household population from Census 1981 was 12,520,402. Population in 'living quarters other than housing units' accounted to 312,562 and was 2.4 percent of the total population. Urban population comprised 14.8 percent of the total population. In Demographic survey 1994, household population estimated was 15,021,336, population in the living quarters other than housing units was 384,250 giving a total of 15,405,586 for the island (excluding Northern and Eastern provinces). These estimates reveal 16.0 percent as the urban population in 1994. The mid year estimates compiled by the Registrar General states a population of 15,220,000 for 1994 (excluding Northern and Eastern provinces) which is little lower than the survey estimate.

5 Limitations

Because of the definitional changes in the 'housing unit' as mentioned above, population comprising more than 5 boarders and lodgers in housing units may have been duplicated in the survey estimates. To remedy this situation this population (5 > boarders and lodgers) should be isolated from the institutional population of Census 1981 or from the household population of the survey, In the Census these households were identified under institutions and cannot be separated as housing units, but in the Demographic Survey these households can be separated and it will be available by sectorwise only after processing of data. However, the total figure shows the bias in the estimates due to above reason is within 0.2 percent.
