

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P R E F A C E



The present publication featuring national accounts statistics for the years 1975 to 1980 has been prepared by the Department of Census and Statistics, the official agency primarily responsible for preparing annual national accounts estimates. Much of the material published in this Bulletin, which is the fifth in the series, was made available earlier in preliminary form for inclusion in the Statistical Abstract and in the Statistical Pocket Book of Sri Lanka, as well as in United Nations publications. The Bulletin series remains, however, the most authoritative and comprehensive source of data in the national accounts field.

Considerable progress has been made within the last year in preparing the annual estimates. The improvements have taken three forms: closer adherence to the definitions and principles of the System of National Accounts (SNA) propounded by the United Nations; the use of better methodology and sources; and the suppression for the time being of components or detail for which an adequate statistical base is still lacking (e.g. the distribution by income shares, capital consumption allowances). The estimates here presented also differ from those published earlier in that the constant-price series use 1975 instead of 1963 as the base year and were compiled to a much greater extent directly from quantum indicators.

Gross domestic product as defined by SNA has been adopted as the key national accounting aggregate but other common variants, including the factor cost versions emphasised in earlier publications, are included in a new reconciliation table. This change was made not only to advance international comparability but also to simplify the presentation for Sri Lankan users. The estimates for the last year covered, 1980, were made within the framework of an input-output table for the first time. The table, which is included in this publication is accompanied by notes which point out some of the main changes in definitions and classifications, as well as the principal data sources used.

The adoption of a new and more recent base year for the estimates in constant prices provided a convenient opportunity to introduce many of the changes required. It was not possible, unfortunately, to carry revisions

back in time beyond 1975 for lack of reliable information. The work of improvement will continue even at the cost of various discontinuities in a number of series. The eventual aim is to produce an integrated system of accounts in line with the recommendation of SNA. The elaboration of the present body of national product statistics in this manner must necessarily follow the further development of Sri Lankan economic statistics, particularly the statistics of income as distinct from production and expenditure.

The Department of Census and Statistics regrets the delay in issuing the present Bulletin. Preoccupation during the last year with a number of major undertakings, especially a new Census of Population and Housing, along with the need to carry through the change in the base year of the constant price estimates and otherwise revise the national accounts statistics, led inevitably to postponement of publication.

The present estimates have been prepared by the National Accounts Division with the advice of Dr. William I. Abraham, U.N. Adviser and Mr. W.S.M. Fernando, Deputy Director and under the direction of Mrs. D.S.L. Weeratunga, Assistant Director and her staff.

GENERAL NOTE

Table 15 is computed according to the standard classification of final expenditure on consumption of households and non profit - making institution specified for purposes of the International Comparison Project (I.C.P.) of the Statistical Office of the U.N. and the World Bank. The above I.C.P. classification and codes follow broadly those suggested in the U.N. system of National Accounts (S.N.A.). It may be noted, however, that the I.C.P. includes (while the S.N.A. excludes) certain final expenditures, such as those on medical and other health services, schools and other educational facilities, recreational and related cultural services and on welfare services by government and by private non-profit institution serving households. The expenditures on the Government components of the above - mentioned items have been estimated for all years and shown separately under the relevant codes.



COMPOSITION OF AGRICULTURE G.D.P. IN 1975 CONSTANT PRICES



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
