Similarly, the average estimate for total employment in the public sector, across the four quarterly reports available for 2018, is 1,158,478 (excluding the armed forces). Of this figure, the average for the share of women is 45.2%.

The data points to the share of women in the public sector being around 45%. The president claimed 70%. Therefore, we classify the president's statement as FALSE.
